



Sleeping bunch of girls not caring about anyone,


Agentlmen trying to help out in every possible way,

The small border town of Dawki in the west Jaintia Hills has the famous river flowing which is the major tourist destination in Meghalaya Dawki lies between India and Bangladesh and it is the trade hub between two countries. It is also famous for the bridge and boat riding competition they host. The water is clear and green. The surrounding greenery makes it more beautiful



The word 'maw 'means 'stone' maw 'phlange 'means' grassy stone ' and is one of the settelements in Khasi Hills named after monoliths.


It's a village filled with beautiful houses and landscapes. Mawphlang has one of the biggest sacred forests in the world.











Each house is named differently by the identity of the kingdom. They typically had a living room, kitchen, toilet, and a varandah or a public space. Each house differs from each other due to the requirements and the area available. Material used for walls was bamboo and thatch. The entire house was constucted using bamboo and thatch. Framework of bamboo suported the doors and

used in order to achieve the desired lenght and thickness. Many houses had a storage place for kitchen which were kept above the fireplace. The living rooms had a raised platform of bamboo for the seating purpose
